Dear Parents and Carers,

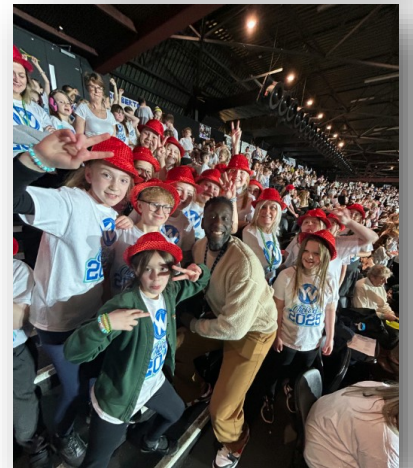

Please remember the first lesson begins at 9:00 which is a core lesson, including RWI. If your child is late they will miss the teacher input - the direct teaching and modelling.

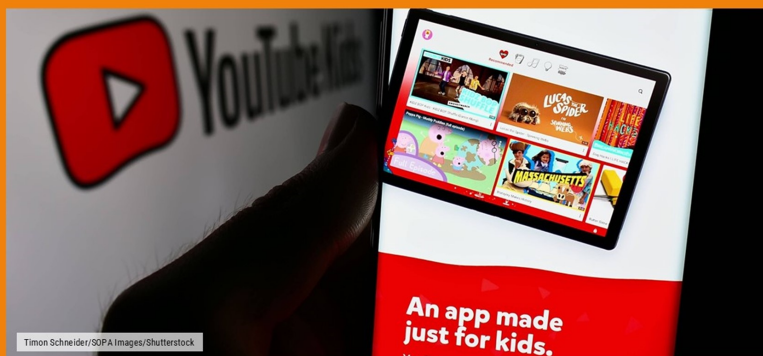


Who are the SUPERSTARS this week?
